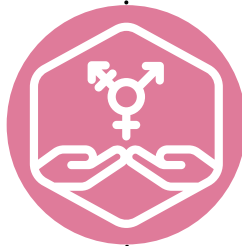
### 1. Effective Instruction

Build on the innovations and effective practices in order to improve teachers' abilities to use resources to create an inclusive environment



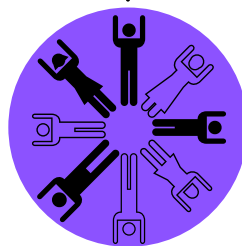
### 2. Promoting Inclusivity

Foster inclusive classroom environment through which learners of diversified backgrounds know that their thoughts and ideas matter, and their opinions and concerns can be voiced in a safe and supportive atmosphere



### 3. Improving education policies & practices

Develop a joint curriculum on inclusivity contributing to the improvement of teachers practices at the EU level



### 4. Preparing for diverse realities

To provide a response to the need of an efficient adaptation of the traditional classrooms to a new, more inclusive environment, open to migrants, socio-economic backgrounds, disabled students, LGBTQI+, among others, with a special focus on safeguarding tolerance, acceptance and inclusion

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## Main Activities and Updates

### First Deliverable of the Project

We are delighted to introduce the first output of the TUTOR project – the Desired Status Report. This comprehensive report delves into the landscape of inclusive education within our partner countries: Greece, Austria, Turkey, and Ireland, as well as the broader European context. The report incorporates insights gathered from an open consultation process conducted in December 2022 and January 2023.

Let's explore the report's key components:

### Transnational Literature Review

This section provides a detailed overview of literature reviewed in our partner countries and at the EU-wide level. It delves into national and EU policies, frameworks, and research regarding inclusive education. A special focus is given to students from LGBTQI+, migrant and ethnic minorities, and socio-economic backgrounds. The report highlights the concept of "intersectionality," which explores how various social identities, such as race, gender, class, and ability, intersect to create unique experiences of privilege, oppression and discrimination. It emphasizes the need to broaden the definition of inclusive education beyond just students with disabilities and education special needs.

### Findings from Open Consultation

The second section presents findings from an open consultation process involving teachers and education stakeholders. These consultations occurred in diverse educational settings, including second level, Vocational Education and Training (VET), and Further Education and Training (FET). The open consultation process mirrors the themes explored in the literature review, including inclusive education, intersectionality, diversity in education, and Initial Teacher Education (ITE) and Continuous Professional Development (CPD) for teachers, with its key themes and recommendations presented on the next page.



## Themes and Recommendations from Partner Countries:

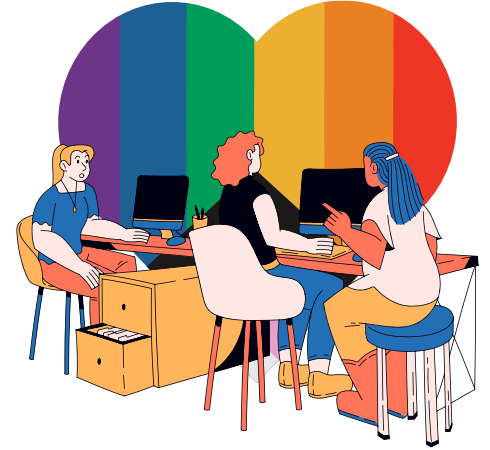
### Greece

Identifies a lack of holistic inclusive education in teacher training. Recommendations include empowering teachers through cooperative teaching, promoting lifelong learning, and creating support networks. Policies and laws supporting diverse needs for inclusion, teacher training in inclusivity, and improved learning environments are also encouraged.



### Austria

Advocates for raising awareness of diversity and inclusion, particularly regarding the Roma community. Focuses on systemic approaches, resource-oriented teaching, and fostering teacher-parent collaboration. Calls for changes at personal, school, and policy levels, emphasizing the need for training and resources.



### Turkey

Highlights the importance of equipping teachers with skills for inclusive education. Suggests ongoing professional development, increased resources, and awareness campaigns. Collaboration among stakeholders and a stronger curriculum on diversity are crucial. Teacher support in creating inclusive classrooms is also emphasized.



### Ireland

Acknowledges a gap between inclusive policies and practical implementation. Challenges include teacher shortages, housing costs and diversity representation in the teaching profession. Advocates comprehensive system changes, teacher training addressing diverse student needs, and the inclusion of various issues within inclusive education.

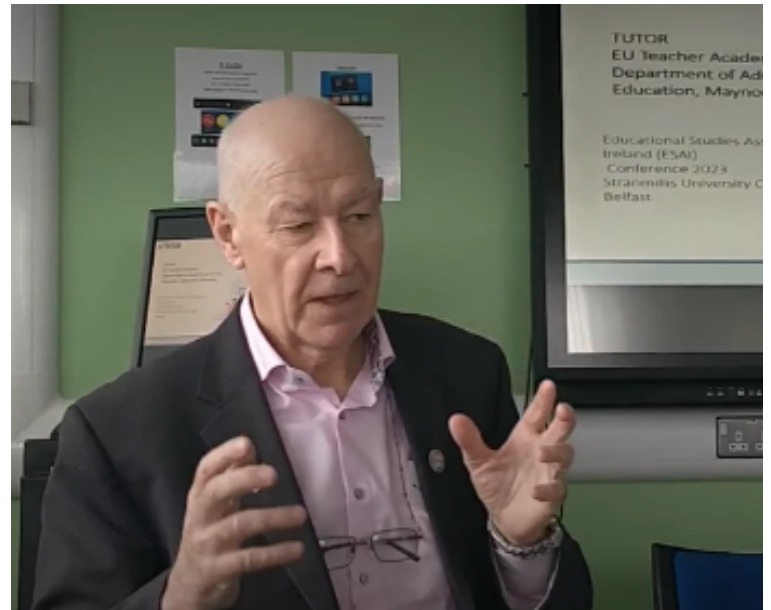
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## Showcasing TUTOR Project's Inclusivity Mission

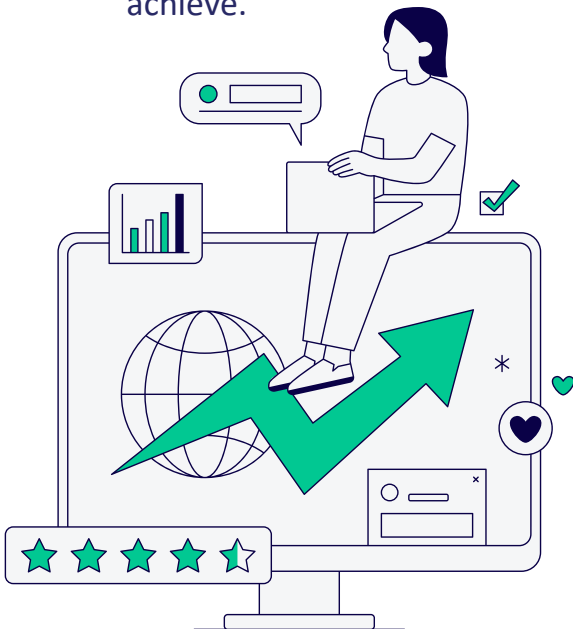
## Unlocking Collaboration: Engaging Stakeholders in Inclusive Education

### Change the focus

Don't focus just on creating programmes for specific target groups. Inclusive education not only means creating these specific programmes but offers learning opportunities and learning environments where all students feel welcome.

### Foster Inclusive leadership & Whole school approach

School leaders need to advocate for activities targeted at improving inclusion, and all teachers, non-teaching staff, parents and local communities' involvement are proved to be beneficial.

### Focus on local needs & specificities

Awareness of the socio-demographic context is vital to be able to design activities focused on inclusive education. Insights can be obtained through statistical data, complemented by intensifying dialogues between school and community, and between staff and individual learners.

### Inclusiveness of education offer

Teachers must be competent and master a range of methods and tools for creating inspiring and inclusive learning. This calls for a focus on continued professional development of teachers.

### Use variety of learning environments

Varied learning environments, including hands-on and non-formal learning, stimulate creativity, self-esteem, and courage to express oneself are crucial to fostering inclusion and well-being. Including virtual and outside school premises environments, has a positive impact on students' motivation, well-being, and academic achievement.

### Include peer-to-peer mentoring

It is an effective way to support students and to help them integrate into the school environment.
