Main Activities and Updates

Insights from the 3rd Transnational Partner Meeting in Vienna

We're excited to share the latest news from the TUTOR project, as our third transnational partner meeting recently took place in Vienna, Austria. Hosted by our Austrian partner OJAB, the meeting spanned from November 30th to December 1st, 2023, gathering our consortium members for critical discussions and progress updates. The primary objective of the meeting was to provide a comprehensive overview of the project's current status, assess progress made thus far, and strategize for upcoming activities. Led by the project coordinator, we delved into technical and financial aspects, with a keen focus on project management and quality assurance. One of the highlights of the meeting was the presentation of key findings from Deliverable 2.3, the Training Needs Analysis Report, by Symplexis. This report serves as a crucial foundation, offering insights into the existing gaps in inclusive education and paving the way for our project's development and implementation strategies.

A significant portion of our discussions revolved around the methodological framework for defining learning objectives and delivering the Joint Curriculum and 3 Specialization Courses. Structured around intersectionality, our curriculum aims to address the needs of diverse learner groups, including LGBTQI+ learners, migrants/refugees, and students from disadvantaged socio-economic backgrounds. Additionally, we delved into the design of learning assessment methodologies and the development of training guides and manuals for trainers. These resources will play a pivotal role in facilitating the implementation of our training program, ensuring its effectiveness and impact.







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On the second day of the meeting, EVBB and EVTA provided updates on dissemination and exploitation efforts. From social media promotions to stakeholder engagement and formulation of policy recommendations, we're actively working to strengthen the upskilling of the teaching workforce in terms of inclusivity. Overall, the third transnational partner meeting proved to be incredibly productive, allowing us to address challenges, clarify uncertainties, and brainstorm solutions collaboratively. Together, we're committed to advancing inclusive education and creating transformative learning environments for all.









Breaking Barriers: TUTOR Project Unveils Insights on Inclusive Practices in Secondary Education

Second Deliverable of the Project

The TUTOR project has achieved a pivotal milestone with the unveiling of its Existing Status <u>Report</u>, marking a significant stride in its three-year endeavor to strengthen inclusive education across the European Union. This report stands as a culmination of exhaustive research efforts aimed at comprehensively understanding the current state of the educational landscape, identifying hurdles, and uncovering avenues for enhancing inclusive practices among teachers and stakeholders.

With inclusivity at its core, the TUTOR project endeavors to cater to the needs of students hailing from marginalized communities, encompassing LGBTQI+ individuals, ethnic minorities, migrants, and those from socioeconomically disadvantaged backgrounds. Research was conducted across four national contexts—Austria, Greece, Ireland, Turkey and supplemented by a regional study spanning the European Union.

Methodology

The Existing Status Report draws upon data gleaned through rigorous methodologies:

• Online Questionnaires: Secondary education teachers and vocational training professionals provided insights into their knowledge, competencies, and training needs related to inclusive education, offering a comprehensive understanding of the educational landscape.





- Focus Groups: Facilitated discussions delved into concepts of inclusive education, intersectionality, and diversity within educational settings, providing valuable qualitative insights.
- · Interviews: Semi-structured interviews with teachers and stakeholders enriched the understanding of inclusive education practices, training experiences, and support systems.







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Key Recommendations

The report underscores several pivotal recommendations, including:

- Advocating for comprehensive professional development programs covering inclusive practices, intersectionality, and classroom management.
- Integrating technology-driven learning into teacher training to equip educators with digital skills.





- Implementing mentoring and peer support programs, fostering collaboration between seasoned educators and newcomers.
- Acknowledging and embracing intersectionality and diverse representation among educational staff and bodies, as well as in curricula and learning materials.
- Recognizing the pivotal role of principals in fostering inclusive cultures and supporting teachers with resilience training to confront biases and facilitate open dialogues.
- Developing systematic monitoring and evaluation mechanisms to gauge the efficacy of teacher training programs and address implementation gaps.



- Establishing comprehensive policy frameworks and a whole-school approach to combat bullying, foster safe environments, and address discrimination effectively.
- Involving students in decision-making processes and cultivating democratic classroom spaces.

The release of the TUTOR project's Existing Status Report marks a significant milestone in the advancement of inclusive education. 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
TUTOR Ambassadors for Turkey

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
TUTOR Ambassador for Greece
